Day 1

Arrival and check-in at The Stables
Ol Pejeta overview, safety orientation and an evening game drive

Day 2

Early morning game drive including a visit to the Sweetwaters Chimpanzee Sanctuary, Ol Pejeta Nature Trail, The Rhino Cemetery and a visit to Morani Information Centre where you will also have an up-and-close encounter with Baraka, the blind rhino, who is our ambassador for black rhinos
Later in the afternoon, you will go on a bushwalk

Day 3

Work with the dogs and K9 anti-poaching unit which will involve you cleaning, feeding and grooming the dogs. You will also train with our tracker dogs as you try to escape their pursuit across the conservancy

Day 4

Field work with the Ecological Monitoring Unit to learn about what it takes to manage a conservation area tracking and identifying predators and assisting with vegetation monitoring

Day 5

Spend the day tracking and monitoring the rhinos in the field
Later on, visit Nanyuki town including The Equator and Cedar Mall

Day 6

Get to work with the northern white rhinos' and Baraka's caregivers
Take the afternoon off

Day 7

Spend half day walking with herders, grazing cattle on the plains as you learn about how Ol Pejeta integrates cattle with wildlife, and uses livestock as a means to manage the rangelands effectively.
Later on, work with the Ecological Monitoring department in the office

Please note that this activity will be confirmed closer to the date

Day 8

Assist the tourism team in the field operations and work with the Logistics department to know and understand the challenges they face to prevent human-wildlife conflict

Day 9

Interact with the Community Development department staff and gain insights into how Ol Pejeta Conservancy works with the communities

Day 10

Spend the day with the Wildlife and the Ecological Monitoring Unit departments, collecting and interpreting data for research purposes and then rhino monitoring in the afternoon

Day 11

Work with the Ecological Monitoring Unit, visiting wildlife migratory corridors, spoor identification and infrared camera servicing and participate in lion tracking and monitoring as well

Day 12

Visit the Mt. Kenya Animal Orphanage for the day

Day 13

Visit Ngare Ndare Forest, a lush indigenous forest at the foothills of Mt. Kenya. Among the activities that one can engage in include a canopy walk, bird watching, forest walk and swimming in the blue pools

Day 14

Early morning game drive
Departure at 10 am after breakfast
