Immerse yourself in nature's raw beauty while camping in the wild at OI Pejeta Conservancy.

DUR CAMPSITES:

HIPPO HIDE CAMPSITE

Situated on the banks of the Ewaso Nyiro River and located close to the Hippo Hide walk way, where you can walk along the river bank while viewing hippos in their natural habitat

OL LERRI CAMPSITE

Ol Lerai is located along the Ewaso Nyiro River and has the two unique features; a little island that's a perfect for a sundowner and an extended river ideal for fishing. It is regularly frequented by herds of elephants and impalas

MURERA DONGA CAMPSITE

This secluded campsite surrounded by acacia trees is situated next to the marsh area in the Conservancy which due to the lush vegetation attracts wildlife throughout the year

EWASO CAMPSITE

Hidden behind bushy vegetation and acacia trees, this campsite on the banks of the Ewaso Nyiro River is a serene haven offering magnificent views of elephants and other wildlife as they gather on the riverbanks


MBOGO CAMPSITE

Mbogo Campsite, named after the buffalo, offers a serene escape with lush marshes, rippling plains, and stunning sundowner views. Located east of the conservancy, it's perfect for peace and rejuvenation

SCOTT'S HIDE CAMPSITE

A hide, or blind, is a camouflaged shelter where people can observe wildlife closely without disturbing them. Get a chance to camp at Scott's Plain next to the hide overlooking a water hole favored by a diverse range of animals. By using the hide as a hideout to spot animals, you can often see some fascinating behavior from both mammals and birds, who might act differently around vehicles and vocal people. When wild animals are completely unaware of human presence, it's amazing what close encounters you can discover







GETTING THERE:

About three (3) and a half hours drive from Nairobi. One (1) hour drive from Nanyuki Airstrip.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. All of our campsites are booked on an exclusive basis and must be booked in advance to ensure availability.
- 2. All campsites are equipped with clean camp toilets, dustbins and fire-pits. A water bowser and firewood will also be provided.
- 3. Campers must carry all of their own camping equipment, food and drink.
- 4. It is mandatory that campers and any ground crew sign the indemnity form on entry into the Conservancy.
- 5. Camping is available throughout the year however during the rainy seasons April /May and September/October campsites are only accessible in a 4WD vehicle.
- 6. If you don't want the hassle of cooking and bringing your own food, we have the perfect solution for you. Morani's Restaurant offers to cater for all your food needs including ready to eat takeaway meals or frozen options that you can prepare at your campsite. NOT INCLUDED:

- 1. Ol Pejeta Conservancy entrance fees are payable at the gate on arrival for each night of your stay.
- 2. On site activities including guided night game drives, lion tracking and bush walks. These can be booked ahead of your visit, or on

arrival (subject to availability)

CAMPSITE DOS AND DON'TS

Do not leave any food or leftovers in the open as this may attract wild animals.

Remember the rule is not to feed the wild animals in their natural environment.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR CAMPERS

Please note that for your safety and to ensure compliance with conservation protocols, it is **mandatory** to have an armed ranger accompany you during your camping experience at OI Pejeta Conservancy.

A fee of Ksh 5,000 per ranger per night applies.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we prioritize your safety and the protection of wildlife.
